Christmas

Christmas is a holiday generally observed on December 25 (with alternative days of January 6, 7 and 19 to commemorate the birth of Jesus, the central figure of Christianity. The exact birthday of Jesus is not known, and historians place his year of birth some time between 7 BC and 2 BC. Narratives of his birth are included in two of the Canonical gospels in the New Testament of the Bible.

The date of Christmas may have initially been chosen to correspond with either: the day exactly nine months after Christians believe Jesus to have been conceived, as John Chrysostom preached in a sermon in Antioch c. 386 which established the date of Christmas as December 25 on the Julian calendar; or as Isaac Newton argued that the date of Christmas was selected to correspond with the winter solstice, which the Romans called bruma and celebrated on December 25.

Today, whether or not the birth date of Jesus is on December 25 is not considered to be an important issue in mainstream Christian denominations; rather, celebrating the coming of God into the world in the form of man to atone for the sins of humanity is considered to be the primary meaning of Christmas. Although nominally a Christian holiday, Christmas Day is celebrated as a major festival and public holiday in countries around the world, including many whose populations...(continued)

Chanukah / Hanukkah

Hanukkah (Hebrew: *הַחֲנוּכָה*) also known as the Festival of Lights, is a Jewish festival, a holiday meaning "dedication" because it marks the re-dedication of the Temple beginning on the 25th day of the Hebrew month of Kislev, after its desecration under Antiochus IV. Hanukkah Spiritually, starts on that same day and commemorates the Miracle of the Oil.

It can occur in very late November, or throughout December. When Hanukkah begins in the last week of December, it continues into the following January.

According to the Talmud, at the re-dedication of the Temple in Jerusalem in the year 165 BCE, following the victory of the Maccabees' military over the Seleucid Empire (Greek-Syrians), there was only enough consecrated olive oil to fuel the eternal flame in the Temple for one day. Miraculously, the oil burned for eight days - which was the length of time it took to press, prepare and consecrate new oil.

On this auspicious day, the festival is observed in Jewish homes by the kindling of lights of a special candelabrum, a Menorah, with nine branches or a Hanukiah. One light is lit on every night of the eight day holiday. One extra light, known as shamash, is also lit everyday and is usually located above or below the rest of the lights

The festivities make the holiday appear like Jewish Christmas. However, Hanukkah is a different festival, which has history and traditions of its own.

Families get together for feasting and playing games. After lighting the Hanukkah candles, traditional food is cooked in Jewish households. The food items prepared are rich in oil and potato pancakes are a special Hanukkah favorite. Israelis eat special Hanukkah doughnuts on this day, which are known as *Sofganiot*. A gift giving tradition has also evolved over the years in many Jewish

Jewish families, from the custom of giving Hanukkah gelt (money) to children. The festival is celebrated with great enthusiasm and joy by the Jews across the world especially for children.



Do Muslims celebrate Christmas?

Muslims do not usually celebrate Christmas because it is typically a Christian holiday.

Eid al-Fitr is an Islamic holiday that symbolizes the breaking of the fasting period and marks the end of the fasting of *Ramadan*. This has to do with the communal aspects of the fast, which expresses many of the basic values of the Muslim community. Fasting is believed by some scholars to extol fundamental distinctions, lauding the power of the spiritual realm, while acknowledging the subordination of the physical realm. (Continued)

Eid in Turkey is a beloved public holiday, where schools and government offices are generally closed for the entire period of the celebrations and is celebrated anywhere between the end of one year or the beginning of the next in the Christian calendar, depending on where it falls that particular year.

Muslims greet each other with '*Happy Eid*'. The Islamic tradition also associates events with the occasion. For example, on Eid al-Fitr, the angel Gabriel descended with white clothes for each of prophet Muhammad's grandsons.

In Turkey, Ramadan celebrations are infused with more national traditions, and where country-wide celebrations are referred to as Bayram. It is customary for people to greet one another with "Bayramınız Mübarek Olsun" ("May Your Bayram Be Holy"). "Mutlu Bayramlar" ("Happy Bayram") is an alternative phrase for celebrating Bayram.

It is a time for people to attend prayer services, put on their best clothes (referred to as "Bayramlık", often purchased just for the occasion) and to visit all their loved ones (such as friends, relatives and neighbours) and pay their respects to the deceased with organized visits to cemeteries, where large, temporary bazaars of flowers, water (for watering the plants adorning a grave), and prayer books are set up for the three-day occasion. The first day of the Bayram is generally regarded as the most important, with all members of the family waking up early, and the men going to their neighborhood mosque for the special Bayram prayer.

It is regarded as especially important to honor elderly citizens by kissing their right hand and placing it on one's forehead while wishing them Bayram greetings. It is also customary for young children to go around their neighborhood, door to door, and wish everyone a happy Bayram, for which they are awarded candy, chocolates, traditional sweets such as Baklava and Turkish Delight, or a small amount of money at every door!

Dr. Eyad Najdawi, president and imam of the Mosque of Sioux City, said Muslims share a reverence of Jesus with Christians and they recognize Christmas is a celebration of His birth. But there is no celebration of that birth in Islam.

"Jesus in Islam is a very big figure," Najdawi said, "but we don't celebrate his birth. But we do not celebrate the birth of the prophet Mohammed."

Many non-Christians still observe the holiday, but choose to focus on secular traditions and family.

"The way most of us like to look at it is most of us are so busy 365 days a year. It's that one time of the year we as a world get to set a day aside for our families," said Dana Gray, an atheist and member of Siouxland Atheists, Agnostics and Freethinkers.

While you won't find members of the group attending church services, most of them will take part in the traditions of putting up Christmas trees, hanging lights and exchanging gifts.

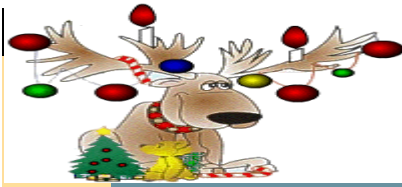

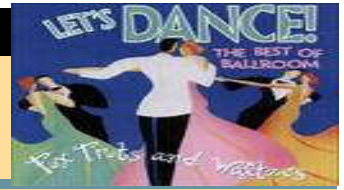
